





Broad Leafed Paperbark

Ideally planted in parks and large gardens as a shade tree, this hardy, drought-tolerant species grows well within the Greater Sydney area. A stately tree with thick whitish papery bark and a rounded crown, the Broad Leafed Paper Bark produces creamy-white brush-shaped flowers which bloom from Autumn to Winter. Establishing in 3 to 5 years and being long-lived, this is a beautiful feature tree that attracts nectar-loving wildlife.
