









Broad-leaved Ironbark

The Broad-leaved Ironbark with its stately habit and dark-brown furrowed bark is native to eastern Australia and is sometimes a habitat tree for Koalas. Often adorned with small white flowers and conical-shaped fruit, the Broad-leaved Ironbark is a hardy species able to grow in relatively infertile soils, it also tolerates frost and extended periods of drought.
