










Cabbage Gum

Cabbage Gum is a large tree grown for its broad canopy, stately habit and attractive smooth bark. It's best suited to open, full-sun positions. Fluffy white flowers appear in clusters during the Summer and are a great source of pollen for honey production. The Cabbage Gum prefers moist, well-drained soils but it will tolerate periods of drought.
