










# Forest Red Gum

The Forest Red Gum is grown for its stately appearance, its rounded crown making it the perfect shade tree for open park locations. This fast-growing species will establish in 3 to 5 years, growing best in an exposed sunny position with deep, moist soils. The Forest Red Gum attracts bees for honey production and is a food tree for Koalas.

 <b>Origin</b>	East coast Australia
 <b>Typical height</b>	30-40m
 <b>Typical width</b>	16m
 <b>Foliage Type</b>	Evergreen
 <b>Leaf</b>	Dark glossy green and pointed, oval-like shape
 <b>Bark</b>	Smooth
 <b>Flowers</b>	White and fluffy clusters
 <b>Fruit Pod</b>	Cup-shaped capsule
