





# Golden Rain Tree

Grown for its spreading crown and its abundant display of yellow flowers, the Golden Rain Tree is native to Korea and is an excellent shade tree particularly in open park areas where it has the space to become spectacular. Establishing in 3 to 5 years, this deciduous species is drought, heat, salt and frost tolerant, ensuring it can handle harsh Australian conditions. Following its display of yellow flowers during Summer, pink seed pods appear in the Autumn. These papery pods accompany the change of leaf colour before the tree drops its leaves for the Winter.
