Illawarra Plum

This large woodland and sub-tropical tree sports fleshy cherry-like blue-black fruit and small green narrow leaves. Often planted in parks and gardens as a lawn specimen for shade, the 'Illawarra Plum' is a fast-growing tree that establishes in 3 to 6 years and matures in 10 years. This species is regarded as one of the best sources of bush tucker by Aboriginal people, the fruit is also used to make jams and spirits.
