

Ivory Curl Tree

The Ivory Curl Tree is originally found in the rainforests of Queensland yet they are surprisingly adaptable to most climates and conditions, with the exception of high frost areas. Parramatta's climate generally stunts the tall, bush-like growth of the tree making it suitable for growth underneath power lines.

The tree is known for its dazzling, long creamy white flower heads that bloom in spring and attract bees, birds and butterflies. The Ivory Curl Tree is resilient to pests and diseases.
