










# Lilly Pilly Resilience

This fast-growing native shrub sports dense, glossy-green foliage with a coppery hue on new growth. The white fluffy flowers appear in Summer followed by edible purple fruit, which is often used to make jam. This versatile species can be pruned for hedging or screening, or trained into an upright habit to form a small tree. Enjoying an open sunny position, it is light frost and drought tolerant and responds well to deep watering in dry periods.
