










# Narrow-leaved Scribbly Gum

With its pale bark and small stature the Narrow-leaved Scribbly Gum is easily suited to a variety of locations. Earning its name from the intricate scribbles that appear as a result of moth larvae that often accompany the tree, varieties of scribbly gum have become a staple of the Australian landscape. This species is fast-growing and enjoys an open, full-sun position with well-drained soils.
