








Native Frangipani

This bright sub-tropical tree, commonly known as the Native Frangipani, has clusters of small flowers from late Spring to early Summer. The delightful flowers change from cream to a deep golden yellow as they mature adding interest to the streetscape. Growing well in a protected sunny to semi-shaded position, this species is frost tender.
