

Red Bloodwood

Naturally found on the east coast of Australia, the Red Bloodwood is known for its spreading crown, reddish straight trunk and attractive large white flowers. Attracting native birds and bees, the Red Bloodwood is used in honey production and is a lovely addition to any landscape.
