










Red Flowering Gum

The Red Flowering Gum is often grown for its bright and abundant flower display which attracts native bees and birds. Establishing in 3 to 5 years and responding well to mulch, the Red Flowering Gum is a pretty street tree that has become one of the most popular Eucalypts widely cultivated in Australia and overseas.
