




# Snow in Summer

Aptly named 'Snow in Summer', this Broad Leafed Paperbark produces an abundance of creamy-white flowers in Summer, so many that the foliage becomes hidden from view. Grown for its upright habit, flowers and papery bark, this species attracts honey-eating birds and bees. It is also a source of tea tree oil, a natural antiseptic which can be used for burns, stings and insect bites.
