

Tallow Wood









The Tallow Wood adds a little contrast and some deep warm colour to the Australian landscape through its dark red-brown rough bark and creamy white flowers. They originate from the east coast of Australia, occurring naturally along rainforest fringes.

Tallow Wood do well in a warmer climate with moist soils yet are able to cope with drought. They love sunlight and require full sun exposure to reach its greatest potential.
