










# Tulipwood

Grown for its rounded crown and colourful fruit, the Tulipwood is hardy and is suited to street planting as it rarely reaches overhead power-lines. The bright yellow fruit generally appear from March to May but can develop at different times throughout the year. Enjoying an open sunny position, the Tulipwood is drought and mildly frost tolerant.

 <b>Origin</b>	East coast Australia
 <b>Typical height</b>	15-28m
 <b>Typical width</b>	20m
 <b>Foliage Type</b>	Evergreen
 <b>Leaf</b>	Dark green leaf with many smaller parts emanating from a central stem
 <b>Bark</b>	Fibrous, flaky
 <b>Flowers</b>	Yellow-green and saucer-shaped
 <b>Fruit Pod</b>	Yellow capsule
