










White Feather Honeymyrtle

Earning its common name 'White Feather Honeymyrtle' from the sweetly scented, fluffy white flowers which bloom from late Spring to early-Summer, this hardy native tree has become a staple in many domestic gardens. With attractive papery bark, dense bushy foliage and growing to an average height of 6 metres, this species serves as an excellent shade tree for street verge locations.
