










# Grey Ironbark

The Grey Ironbark is grown for its dense spreading crown and dramatic floral display which sees fluffy cream flowers blanketing the tree from Autumn to early-Winter. Often planted in parks and large gardens where there is space to spread, the Grey Ironbark is fast growing and long lived - its dark-green glossy leaves making it a lovely shade tree. It prefers full sun and once established can tolerate periods of drought.

 <b>Typical height</b>	20-30m

 <b>Foliage Type</b>	Evergreen
 <b>Leaf</b>	Dark glossy green and pointed, oval-like shape
 <b>Bark</b>	Furrowed
 <b>Flowers</b>	Cream and fluffy
 <b>Fruit Pod</b>	Cup-shaped capsule
