









Topography






Day Heat Map



European History & Setting

1788 A settlement was established in Parramatta (Rose Hill) as the soil at Farm Cove (Farm Cove is located between Circular Quay and Woollomooloo Cove) was very poor for growing crops.




Heritage

Parramatta CBD has a number of local and state heritage listed sites and one World heritage listed item, buildings and archaeological sites are listed.


Parramatta was essential to the survival of the Europeans at the beginning of British colonisation. It was soon realised after the arrival of the First Fleet that the land around Farm Cove would not support the colony, he (Arthur Philip) accelerated his program of exploration to seek more fertile land elsewhere (B. Fletcher 1976 as cited by T. Cass, C. Liston & J. McClymont 1996). The area around Parramatta was discovered to have fertile land and became the food bowl for the fledgling colony as well as an important centre for government, Parramatta was the site of the Governor's House (now known as Old Government House).

The Darug people are the traditional owners of the main east-west ridge of the Blue Mountains, the northern Blue Mountains and the Cumberland Plain (Tindale 1974; Attenbrow 2003 cited by Coomber Consultants 2015). When a development is proposed in Parramatta CBD an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment is required to ensure that any remnants of indigenous occupation are preserved and/or documented.



Existing Building Footprints




Existing & Proposed Building Footprints





Street Hierarchy




Pedestrian Hierarchy Network




Pedestrian Count - 2016



Transport & Parking

Parramatta Station - Located on the Main Western line is served by Sydney Trains T1 Western Line, T2 Inner West & Leppington, T5 Cumberland Line services and NSW TrainLink Blue Mountains Line, Central West XPT and Outback Xplorer .


Buses - The city is served by buses to the Parramatta Transport Interchange near Parramatta Station. Bus routes connect Parramatta with other Sydney destinations like Castle Hill, Hornsby, Ryde, Strathfield and the Sydney city centre.

Free Parramatta Shuttle Bus - Operating on a continuous loop starting from Bankwest Stadium on O'Connell Street, the shuttle bus also connects ferry transport interchanges with local clubs, shops and other community hubs.


Ferry - Ferries run between Circular Quay and Parramatta Wharf.

Light Rail - Stage 1 of Parramatta Light Rail will connect Westmead to Carlingford via Parramatta CBD and Camellia.

Metro - Parramatta CBD to Sydney CBD via the Bays Precinct and Sydney Olympic Park.



Education

Education and Training broadly in Parramatta and employs over 12,000 workers. Currently there are over 25,000 university students across Parramatta (Westmead to Parramatta South campus), and that is expected to grow to over 35,000 by 2030. There will be a significant student presence in Parramatta, particularly around the station precinct.

Arthur Philip High School is the first NSW public high-rise high school (opened 2020) and Parramatta Public School has also been upgraded recently.


Parramatta CBD has five university campasus University of Western Sydney, University of New South Wales, University of New England and Swinburne University of Technology.

WSU Parramatta City Campus - Parramatta Square - Approximately 6,500 students enrolled with potentially 10,000 dtudent visits a week.



Swinburne University of Technology - Sydney campus for the university located in Fitzwilliam Street


WSU/NSW Engineering and Innovation Hub - Hassall Street - Expected to cater to 1,600 students. To be completed by 2021.


Arts & Culture


Riverside Theatres is the premier performing arts venue in Western Sydney. Riverside is the centrepiece of performance culture in Sydney's central city.
