




Parramatta Light Rail

You can also have less waste by packing lunches in containers you can use again.


More cashless carparks

There are changes to how traffic runs in the area.





· A fence that goes all around


Water stations

This is called the T-Way.




The T-Way makes it safer and nicer for people to get around on foot or bike.
